## **Deliverance-Dedication**

*Psalms 32:7 (KJV Strong's) Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah.*

Deliverance is defined by Merriam

Webster as “the state of being saved from something dangerous or unpleasant”. Aren’t you glad that you have been delivered from something dangerous and unpleasant? Most of the time when we think of deliverance, we only think of being delivered from the place called Hell, the place the Bible says is where torment, weeping, wailing, and gnashing of teeth take place in a fire that cannot be quenched. (Luke 16:23-31; Mark 9:43-48; Matthew 25:30; Luke 13:28)

But the truth is, we are delivered from more than just one thing, one place, or one circumstance, we are delivered from many things in which we can give praise and worship unto the Lord. Many are delivered from fear. Others may be delivered from arrogance. Some may be delivered from sickness. Some may be delivered from harm. Some may be delivered from drinking. Now we must ask ourselves the question, since we have been delivered, now what? Now that we have been delivered from our sins, we must now become dedicated. Dedicated to what? Dedicated to the Lord by keeping his commandments. Dedicated to the work of the Lord so we
