

## **Looking For Something New**

Proverbs 27:20 Hell and destruction are never full; so the eyes of man are never satisfied.

Solomon was the son of David and Bathsheba. Solomon succeeded David to rule

Israel. In 1 Kings 3:5-13 we see the Lord appearing to Solomon and asking him what he would like for the Lord to give him. His answer may be surprising, for he didn't ask to live a long life, to be rich, nor the life of his enemies, but Solomon simply wanted an understanding heart so he could discern between the good and bad among the people. Solomon received his request and the Lord also gave him what he didn't ask for, riches and honor so that there would not be another king like unto him all the days he lived. The Book of Proverbs is attributed to Solomon and is a collection of moral and philosophical sayings presented in a unique expressive form. This Book gives insight to many things each of us encounter in life.

It's sad to watch the pursuit of man looking and searching for a new high, new buzz, or a new way to numb their minds from reality. Lives are being destroyed, devastated, and lost.

We have to be careful what we pursue. Our appetites of the flesh can lead us down a destructive path. Our pursuit of something new or different can lead us away from God. Instead of looking for something new, why not look unto Jesus? He satisfies! He restores! He saves! Pursue Jesus and be satisfied!
