Repeating What Doesn't Satisfy

John 4:13-14 (KJV Strong's) 13 Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: 14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him

a well of water springing up into everlasting life.

When the Samaritan woman met Jesus at the well, Jesus began a conversation with her with the simply asking for her to give him some water to drink. This conversation was a surprise to the woman since she was a Samaritan and Jesus was a Jew and the Samaritans and Jews didn't have any dealings with each other.

Jesus then told the woman that if she had ask Him for something to drink, He would have given her Living Water. The woman then looked at Jesus and noticed that He had nothing to draw with, so how was Jesus going to give her any water. She was about to learn that Jesus was not talking about the water in the well, but was in reference to receiving the Holy Ghost.

The woman came to the well everyday to get water. Each day she had to repeat the trip for more water. Each day she repeated something that would not give her permanent satisfaction. The trip to the well only provided a temporary fix for the need for water. An interesting note, most Bible Scholars agree, water once it is put in a vessel or stored ceases to be termed as living water, so this could have been the

reason the Samaritan woman couldn't comprehend how Jesus could give her Living Water.. Water left out will evaporate. So each trip to the well, was a repeating of what couldn't permanently solve her problem.

But then she met Jesus! The repetitive trip to the well was about to give her a new opportunity. Jesus offered the woman Water that would be in her springing up unto everlasting life. Jesus was offering salvation to a woman who had always been told she was not to be associated with the Jews. Jesus was giving her a solution to a life that was full of repetitive actions that wouldn't and couldn't satisfy.

How many folks today follow the same repetitive actions trying to find satisfaction? How many people wake up in the morning, follow the same routine, bound by the same addictions, deceived by the same vices, only to repeat the same thing the very next day?

Jesus can change your routine. Jesus can give you something that will change your life. Don't keep repeating the same mistakes. Don't keep repeating the same lifestyle that doesn't bring satisfaction. Let Jesus turn your life around!
