Division Over Vision

John 9:15-21 Then again the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. He said unto them, He put clay upon mine eyes, and I washed, and do see. 16 Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the sabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles? And there was a division among them. 17 They say unto the blind man again, What sayest

thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is a prophet. 18 But the Jews did not believe concerning him, that he had been blind, and received his sight, until they called the parents of him that had received his sight. 19 And they asked them, saying, Is this your son, who ye say was born blind? how then doth he now see? 20 His parents answered them and said, We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind: 21 But by what means he now seeth, we know not; or who hath opened his eyes, we know not: he is of age; ask him: he shall speak for himself.

What a great miracle, a man that was born blind, lived a life of not seeing, and then was healed! Jesus made clay and put it upon the eyes of the blind man, but the healing came when the blind man followed the directions of Jesus and went and washed in the pool of Siloam.

The Pharisees sought to discredit Jesus and others did not believe that the blind man had actually been blind. There was division over vision! Isn't it amazing that so much controversy could arise over a

miracle? Isn't it sad that so much division came over vision? Look at the doubt of the unbelieving Jews in the way they questioned the parents, "...Is this your son, who ye say was born blind?" This appears to be question of whether the blind man was actually blind, insinuating that it was this some kind of hoax.

How is it that so much confusion was stirred up over vision being restored? Some were upset because it was the Sabbath, some were upset because they didn't believe it was real, and others, I feel, were just caught up in the discussions and division.

Instead of division over vision, let's strive in 2020 to have 20/20 vision of what Jesus wants to accomplish in our lives and in the Church. Let's pray for clarity to see the direction the Lord wants us to go in in 2020. Let's pray for perfect spiritual vision so we can see the Will of God.

Don't be blinded by division, get perfect vision through unity.
