Snow Storms And Prophecies

Usually I start the lesson with Scripture and then go into the explanations and comparisons, but due to the title of today's lesson, I feel I need to explain the title before we get to the Scripture.

Have you ever noticed that when the forecast of a snow strom comes from some weather source that people begin the mad rush to buy bread and milk? It doesn't matter if you have just bought bread and milk, you go and buy more bread and milk. To some it doesn't even matter if they like bread and milk, they still go buy it, for that's what you do when you hear of a coming snow storm. I don't know who started it, who spread the instructions from generation to generation, but we have heard it so much that even if we don't go and buy bread and milk, we think about it. So somebody got the message across.

Bible Prophecy should get our attention with the same tenacity as buying bread and milk before a snow storm. We should prepare for the coming prophecies. We should effectively pass instructions for being prepared to the next generation. We need to successfully convince them that the Word of God is true and what it says will happen. We must be successful in getting the message across.

Reading the Bible is a good resolution to make at the beginning of the year. Also we need to do more than read the Word, we need to understand the Word of God. And we need to do more than just read and understand the Word of God, we must become doers of the Word.

This year, start reading your Bible, studying it, understanding it, and doing it! Pass this process onto your children, successfully translating truth from one generation to another.

Now to the Scripture text: Amos 8:11-13 Behold, the days come, saith the Lord God, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord: 12 And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east, they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the Lord, and shall not find it. 13 In that day shall the fair virgins and young men faint for thirst.
