Are We There Yet?

Deuteronomy 2:7 For the Lord thy God hath blessed thee in all the works of thy hand: he knoweth thy walking through this great wilderness: these forty years the Lord thy God hath been with thee; thou hast lacked nothing.

How many times while traveling did you ask your parents, "Are We There Yet?" Or perhaps "How Much Longer Is It Going To Be?". Well I

probably made traveling any distance over 20 miles a nightmare for my parents. I didn't want to take any scenic routes or detours that would result in a longer than necessary amount of time spent in a car as we passed that Maxwell House coffee can around and took our turns regurgitating what was an enjoyable meal earlier in the day. I just wanted to get there as quick as possible.

When the children of Israel left Egypt, they were, by some scholars estimates, 250-300 miles from the Promised Land—Yet it took them 40 years to get there! I wonder if their kids asked, "Are We There Yet?", or "How Much Longer?". Well, back to the journey. If estimates are accurate that it was 250 miles from Egypt to the Promised Land, that would mean that they could have reached the Promised Land in about 10-15 days according to a Biblical Day's Journey, and yet we see them traveling 40 years, not 40 days, and not forty weeks, but 40 years.

The Bible gives us insight into the reasons. The Bible tells us that they wandered for 40 years because of

their sin (**Hebrews 3:17**) and unbelief (**Hebrews 3:19**). And the Bible also tells us that they had to wander in the wilderness until all people 20 years old and upwards were dead. (**Numbers 14:29**).

While we are faced with this journey of the Covid-19 virus, we all want it to be over soon. People are growing restless. People are starting to complain. But we must all keep walking one step at a time and one day at a time. We don't know when this pandemic is going to end, but we do know it is going to end. And while the Israelites traveled 40 years instead of 10-15 days, we too may have to travel this wilderness more than 15 days. Instead of falling in this wilderness, let this be a time of re-educating us to trust the Lord.
