## Watchman, What Of The Night!

**Isaiah 21:11-12 The burden of Dumah. He calleth to me out of Seir, Watchman, what of the night? Watchman, what of the night? 12 The watchman said, The morning cometh, and also the night: if ye will enquire, enquire ye: return, come.**

The watchmen on the wall of a city were consulted day and night concerning what they saw. If they didn't see any danger or trouble, they would tell the people that everything was good. If they saw an

enemy approaching, they would give the people warning. They only reported what they saw.

God's ministers are as watchmen on the wall of the city, placed on the *wall* of their *city* proclaiming encouragement or warnings from the pulpit. We, as ministers, must rise to the challenge of the day and speak what the Lord has for us as His people.

One of the common questions of our day is, "*When do you see an end to this pandemic?*" or "*When do you think we will get back to normal?*" These questions concerning the pandemic are really *dependent*, meaning the answers will be dependent upon a daily assessment. *One Day At A Time* could be sung consistently during this pandemic.

The same holds true to our lives with the Lord. We must take one day at a time. But with the Lord, we can proclaim what the watchman answered in Is. 21, '*...morning cometh...*' With the Lord there will be a better day. With the Lord there will be a *morning*. This *night* will not last. The watchman said in Isaiah two things:

1. The morning cometh
2. Also the night

As long as we are upon this earth, we are going to have *days and nights*. We are going to have good times and bad times. We are going to have challenges and triumphs.

So watchman, what of the night—morning is coming! Watchman, what of the morning—night is coming! While life has it's ups and downs, there is a Constant, a Rock, through our day and night seasons--Jesus Christ. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. (Hebrews 13:8).

I want to encourage someone going through his or her night--morning is coming. I also want to warn someone in his or her morning--night is coming.

Be strong; be encouraged, you are not alone for Jesus will be with you through your *night* and through your *day*.
