The Importance Of History These Stones Mean Something

Joshua 4:5-7 And Joshua said unto them, Pass over before the ark of the Lord your God into the midst of Jordan, and take ye up every man of you a stone upon his shoulder, according unto the number of the tribes of the children of Israel: 6 That this may be a sign among you, that when your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying, What mean ye by these stones? 7 Then ye shall answer them, That the waters of Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord; when it passed over Jordan, the waters of Jordan were cut off: and these stones shall be for a memorial unto the children of Israel for ever.

I recently found an article that was written from an interview with an old friend of mine that gave the history of the area I grew up in. If you had given me that article when I actually lived in those places, I probably wouldn't have given it a second look, but now that I am 62 years old, I began to read with enthusiasm this historical account and recollections of where I spent my younger days. It was history—my history.

History tells us where we've been, what happened, and something to compare with how we have improved over the years.

History gives us a glimpse into a past that most of us don't remember, because we were not living in those times. History gives us a peek into what it was like in a different time, letting us get into the thoughts and processes of different people.
