

Time To Winterize!

<u>Matthew 24:12-13</u> And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.

It is that time of year when you start to think about *winterizing* your homes, boats, and automobiles. You know that if you fail to *winterize*, you will suffer the damaging and destructive consequences of the cold temperatures. You realize that the cold can destroy what you have worked so hard to gain. We, as Christians, must constantly be aware of the need for protection from *spiritual coldness*. Many things around us can have a damaging and destructive effect upon us that would result in growing cold in our walk with the Lord. The Bible uses the word *iniquity* to show why the love of many is growing cold. Iniquity was translated from the Greek word anomia (an-omee'-ah); which refers to illegality, such as violation or transgression of law.

Many wonder why folks today have seemingly lost their courtesy and respect for others. Many wonder why folks have a *don't care* attitude along with *unreachable emotions*. Well the answer is because of the affluence of iniquity! Folks are drifting further and further into the abyss of coldness that will cause many to be lost.

So how do we as Christians protect ourselves from growing cold? How do we avoid being pulled in by the coldness of the world? We must *winterize* ourselves with Holy Ghost fire! The only way you can avoid the destructiveness of iniquity is to stay faithful to the Lord! We must be faithful in attendance, Hebrews 10:25 says, Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. We must stay faithful in prayer, 1 Thessalonians 5:17 says, Pray without ceasing. We must stay faithful in the Word, John 8:31-32 says, Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

Winterize yourself and avoid the *cold*, because iniquity is not confined to just one season!
