Matthew 12:25 "And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand:"

When the question of whether Jesus was casting out devils by Beelzebub, the prince of devils, Jesus gave them an answer that they couldn't dispute.
