Will Truth Turn You Away?

<u>Proverbs 11:14</u> "Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety."

If you are like me and most other folks, when you have a question, you want the right answer. If you stop and ask directions to a particular place, you don't want someone giving you directions that will lead you to the wrong side of town. And if you don't understand something, you want to know what is right, you don't want someone's opinion that is not even in the *ballpark* of the correct answer. Getting Biblical answers is no different.

When it comes to salvation, it is imperative that folks get the right counsel. Sadly to say, not everyone will give you the right counsel. But proper counsel is something that must be implemented without respect of persons. Families sometimes compromise for families. Friends sometimes compromise for friends, but you can't select who you give good counsel to, you have to give it to all.

Right counsel is something that is getting harder to find and even harder to accept that one might think. Right counsel is not something to hurt you, but rather, something to help you. Right counsel is not something to deny you, but rather something to bless you. Right counsel plays an important part in your future.

Now the question arises, Will the truth turn you away? Will the truth cause you to think less of the *truth-bearer*? Will hearing the truth cause you to think of the *truth-bearer* as your enemy? Well, you might be saying to yourself, "*no way would I think of someone who is telling me the truth as being my enemy*." And yet many folks who stand for truth and preach truth are made to feel this way. Even Paul said to the Galatian Church in <u>Galatians 4:16</u> "Am I therefore become your enemy, because I tell you the truth?"

What effect will truth have on you? Before you answer that, remember a man by the name of Peter? He boldly proclaimed, "...Though all men shall be offended because of thee, yet will I never be offended..." And when Jesus told him that before the cock crow, that Peter would deny Him three times. Peter again boldly proclaimed, "...Though I should die with thee, yet will I not deny thee..." Well, Peter did deny the Lord--three times.

We have to approach the receiving of right counsel with the right spirit. If you can lay aside *self*, you can receive truth! Remember, the best Counselor you have is the Counselor Himself—Jesus Christ—the Truth!
