

## Committed To The Cross

This is week 2 of our journey as we are looking at some of the events that led to the Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Jesus.

The symbol of the Cross is often displayed but sketchily understood. The cross is more than a symbol, the crucifixion more than a legend, and Easter is more than just a once-a-year celebration. The events of Easter affects us throughout our lives.

After celebrating the Passover Meal, Jesus took Peter, James, and John to a garden near the Mount of Olives called Gethsemane. Jesus went a little further than the disciples and began to pray. Jesus will always go a little further than those who follow Him! This is a great lesson for all of us as leaders, parents, and Christians—we need to set the example of going a little further, leading folks into a closer relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus gave an example of being committed in all of the areas below:

- > The Prayers Of Gethsemane
- Jesus Is Arrested
- Peter Denies The Lord
- The Death Of Judas
- > The Trial Of Jesus Christ

Everything that Jesus did was to teach and be an example to the others. When Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsamane, He prayed asking that the "cup", the suffering that was ahead, would be taken from Him. He then said words that we too must learn to pray, "Not my will be done but thine". Jesus was committed to the cross in the face of great suffering. Jesus returns from prayer finding the disciples asleep. When Jesus returns, will He find you asleep? Judas makes arrangement to have Jesus arrested. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss and for 30 pieces of silver. When Jesus asked who they were looking for, the soldiers said, "Jesus of Nazareth", and when Jesus said, "I am He", they all fell backward to the ground. Peter draws a sword and cuts off the right ear of Malchus, one of the high priest's servants. Jesus heals Malchus' ear and then they lead Jesus away. Jesus was committed to the cross in the face of betrayal.

Peter, the defender, now becomes Peter the denyer! Peter followed in a distance, is accused three times of being with Jesus and denies the association with Jesus three times.

Judas, in the meantime, wants to reverse what he has done, even trying to give the money back. The weight was too heavy, the guilt and shame was overwhelming and Judas went out and hanged himself.

The trial of Jesus, we see Him being passed from Pilate to Herod and back to Pilate. With a mob stirred up, the crowd was given a choice to release Barabbas or Jesus—the crowd in an uproar ask for Barabbas to be released and for Jesus to be crucified. Jesus was committed to the cross in the face of crucifixion.
