Journey To The Cross

For the next 4 weeks, we are going to be looking at some of the events that led to the Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Jesus.

Today we want to focus on the days leading to the crucifixion of our Lord. The journey to the cross gives us some invaluable lessons. Let's



look into some of these lessons as we make our Journey To The Cross.

When we look at the journey to the cross, we see four events:

- The Triumphal Entry (John 12:12-19)
- Alabaster Anointing (Mark 14:3-9)
- Betrayal By A Friend (Matt 26:14-16)
- The Lord's Supper (Matt 26:17-35)

The week of the Passover starts with Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Jerusalem was buzzing with the Jews preparing for the celebration of the Passover. Passover was an eight-day feast. It commemorated the Israelite's departure from Egypt. Passover refers to how the Israelites were spared (passed over) when the firstborn in Egypt died.

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on an unbroken colt. This was a time when people spread their garments in the path of Jesus and began to praise and cry Hosanna.

Another event leading to the cross was when Jesus was in Bethany, resting in the home of Simon the leper, when a woman came with a box of very expensive perfume. The Bible calls it "ointment of spikenard". She began to anoint the head of Jesus.

We then venture to another event, Jesus is betrayed by a friend. Judas Iscariot, one of the

twelve disciples, has been in negotiations with the chief priests, elders, scribes, and Caiaphas the High Priest concerning turning Jesus over to them for thirty pieces of silver. The deal was set, the sign of a kiss was planned, now they would wait for the perfect time.

And the other event that we want to bring to your attention is that of what we commonly refer to as the Lord's Supper. While Jesus was celebrating the Passover with His disciples, He revealed that one of them would be betray Him. This saddened the disciples and they each began to ask, "Lord, is it I?". Jesus even had to deal with the disciples losing focus of what was ahead, by arguing over who was the greatest.

Peter says he would never abandon Jesus, even saying he would be willing to die for Him. But Jesus reveals that before the rooster would crow, Peter would deny Him three times.

Then Jesus breaks bread and refers to this as His body, and drinks from the cup, referring to his blood which would be shed. Jesus gave them instructions to continue to observe this, for as often as they do, they are remembering the Lord's death until He comes.
