Is Coming Out And Separate Two Different Things?

2 Corinthians 6:17-18 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, 18 And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.day of salvation.)

Is coming out and being separate two different things? Is it possible to come out from something without being separate? Let's take a closer look at these two things in 2 Cor. 6:17.

The Greek word for *come out* is *exerchomai*, also translated "*depart out of*; *escape*; *and simply get out*.". And the Greek word for *separate* is *aphorizō* and is translated as "*to set off by boundary, limit, divide, and sever*". Since there are two different Greek Words with two distinctly different meanings, we can conclude that, it would be possible to come out of something without being separate.

We can see this when the children of Israel *came out* of Egypt. Exodus 32 tells us that they came up out of Egypt, but were still "*connected*" to idol worship. They had not separated themselves from the influences of Egypt. It almost appears *too easy* for them to turn to idol worship. If they had truly been separated from it, they would not have so easily turned back to it.

The influences of the world are strong. You can come out of the world and attend church and still not be separate—falling quickly back into sin, bad influences, and old habits. Paul said to not only come out from among them, but to also be separate. We have to set boundaries in our lives. We have to place limitations on our flesh. We have to sometimes sever relationships that are not healthy. The process is called separation. Don't just come out but be separate. Don't just change who you hang out with, change what you do. Don't just attend church, become the Church.

Have you come out from among the world? Are you separate? If you haven't done both, you will find it easy to keep going back to the bad habits of Egypt.
