PRODUCE IN YOUR SEASON

Genesis 1:14 (KJV) 14 And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years:

When God created everything, He set the world

as we know it in order. And with that order saying, These men are the servants of the most comes seasons.

We are entering the season of Fall. This time of year is an exceptional time in East KY, as the hills come alive with color and beauty as each tree displays its own uniqueness as their leaves change color. In order for this beauty to transpire, the air has to get colder and the tree starts going into a shutdown or dormant state for the approaching winter months.

What looks like death, is preservation and protection from dying. The tree enters a state of inactivity much in the same way a bear would enter hibernation. The bear doesn't die, it simply becomes less active.

Seasons have a way of changing us as the people of God. Some seasons, we flourish, become fruitful, and display our strengths, at other times, we become inactive, unfruitful, and display weaknesses.

Seasons have a way of changing our appearance. Seasons of life produce wrinkles and gray hair. Seasons have a way of changing our outlook on life. Seasons have a way of changing how we deal with things. And sometimes, seasons have a way of shutting us down.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 says: 1 To every thing there is

a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: So we understand that seasons will come our way.

While seasons bring about change, seasons also produces resiliency. Just like a tree that looks like it is dying, but survives the harshness of winter, we as the people of God sometimes go through our seasons, seasons that produce resiliency, seasons that may slow us down but don't shut us down. Psalms 1:3 gives us hope--verse 3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

If someone you know seems to be inactive, withdrawn, or not as involved in Church services like they once were, don't write them off as dying, they may just be going through a season. Produce in your season!
